## Scientists and Their Contributions Voxel Art Design Contest Award Presentation Ceremony Concludes Successfully

Organised by the Council of the Hong Kong Laureate Forum ("the HKLF"), Index Game and The Sandbox, the "Scientists and Their Contributions Voxel Art Design Contest" successfully concluded and the award presentation ceremony was held today. Guests including **Ms Becky Wong**, Chief Operation Officer and co-founder, Index Game, **Mr Erich Wong**, Head of Growth (Hong Kong), The Sandbox, **Dr Jimmy Wong**, Executive Director of the Hong Kong Academy of Gifted Education and **Prof Timothy Tong**, **BBS**, **JP**, Chairman of the HKLF presented certificates and prizes to commend participants of the contest.

"Scientists and Their Contributions Voxel Art Design Contest" is designed for secondary students. Participants are required to create a voxel character of scientist by using voxel art editing tools and introduce the scientists and their contributions to science. It aims to promote understanding and interests of the young generation in Hong Kong in various disciplines in science and technology in an up-and-coming channel. The contest attracted 21 teams of students coming from 11 secondary schools. They devoted about two months to attending the editing tools workshop, creating and submitting the voxel art masterpiece. After careful assessments, the teams from Cotton Spinners Association Secondary School, Hong Kong University Graduate Association College and Fukien Secondary School were awarded Champion, 1<sup>st</sup> Runner-up and 2<sup>nd</sup> Runner-up respectively. As a reward, the members of the Champion team were granted a unique opportunity for a 2-day internship at Index Game. This internship allowed them to gain valuable insights into the daily routine and practices of a voxel artist.


In delivering his welcome remarks, **Prof Timothy Tong**, Chairman of the HKLF said, "Young people are our future, and we hope to explore not only traditional platforms but also emerging ones, such as promoting science in virtual worlds or blending art and science together." **Chau Xin**, team leader of the Champion team from Cotton Spinners Association Secondary School said after he was presented the award, "We have gained a lot from this contest, especially the importance of cooperating with my teammates when working on science or art fields. Also, the 2-day internship was an invaluable experience for me and my teammates."

To enable more secondary students to be inspired and embark on the journey of scientific discovery, the HKLF will be organising more science-related events and activities.
